

Night in woods chills hunter

Fifty-one-year-old George Paul has decided to take a little break from hunting. After last night's experience you can't really blame him.

Paul and his brother-in-law Charles Higgins, 58, both of 3144 Harriot, took the day off Friday to go hunting on Sooke Mountain.

Arriving early in the morning, they had walked about four miles up the mountain when Paul spied a deer in the distance.

Striking off alone, he started to track the animal down ravines and across pastures, through the thick forest and clumps of salal.

An hour-and-a-half later Paul suddenly realized he was lost.

Abandoning the hunt he found a logging road which he thought would lead to where he'd left Higgins. He ended up at an old logging site.

He found another trail and just as the sun was setting came out at a tiny lake.

Stumbling through the dark he searched for other trails.

He said he kept on walking because whenever he stopped he felt the cold and his legs got cramps.

Meanwhile, Higgins had alerted Sooke RCMP and a search was organized. Ten members of the Sooke Search and Rescue team spent the night driving the old logging roads looking for some sign of the missing man.

As dawn broke the Colwood RCMP dog team joined the searchers. Plans were made to bring in the RCMP helicopter when the mist had lifted.

But at 9 a.m. the search was called off when Paul came out of the bush at the reservoir on Humpback Road. He found the gateman who contacted police.

Paul has no idea how many miles he walked.

He said he has only one thought on his mind today: a nice long bath and then to bed.

Via Rail denies any curbs

MONTREAL (CP) — Via Rail denied Friday that it is restricting the number of coaches and sleeping-cars on long-distance trains during the busy Christmas season and says it will even be adding extra trains on some routes.

Transport 2000, a pro-passenger train group, said in a letter to the Canadian transport commission this week that Via is making only marginal provisions during the peak travel period and turning away would-be passengers.

But Via spokesman Brian Heath said the accusations "just don't make sense."

Tax break on BRIC sales

Revenue Canada has granted a tax break to B.C. residents who picked up five free shares of the B.C. Resources Investment Corp.

The tax department has announced that for taxation purposes, the base price of the shares will be \$6 each.

This means that people who have sold their shares will be taxed on half of what they earned in excess of \$6.

Originally, Revenue Canada had said the base price would be zero meaning that people who sold their shares would be taxed on half of the proceeds.

Those who bought shares will have to use the purchase price as the base for tax calculations.
