## Obituaries



**McLINTOCK, Barbara**  
December 10, 1950 - December 28, 2018

A trail-blazing reporter, a dedicated coroner, an avid ornithologist, a Girl Guide leader, and a lover of cats and horses, "McTick" died in Victoria Hospice on December 28 from complications due to thyroid cancer, with close friends by her side. She was 68.

Barbara Jean McLintock was born in Regina, grew up in the Winnipeg suburb of Fort Garry, earned a degree in psychology at the University of Winnipeg, and headed west the day after her graduation.

At age 22, she got a job covering the BC legislature for the Province newspaper, and two years later, was acclaimed as both the youngest-ever, and the first woman, to be President of the Press Gallery. She was promoted to Victoria Bureau Chief in 1974, and three years later, was lured away to become editor of the Victoria Times.

When the Times and the Daily Colonist merged, Barb moved east to work in the Southern News Bureau in Ottawa before being hired back by The Province as Victoria Bureau Chief in 1982 -- a position which she held until her retirement due to corporate down-sizing in 2003.

While a reporter, Barb wrote two books: "Anorexia's Fallen Angel: The Untold Story of Peggy Claude-Pierre and the Controversial Montreux Clinic," and "Smoke-Free," which detailed how Victoria became the first city in Canada to effectively ban smoking in indoor public places.

Within months of retiring, Barb was hired as the first Legislative reporter for TheYee.ca, and also did some freelance work, including fill-in talk show hosting on C-FAX 1070 Radio. Barb became a part-time Community Coroner in 2004, a full-time Coroner in 2006, and then in 2011, became spokesperson for the BC Coroners Service, a position which she held until her retirement from full-time in 2017.

In her spare time, Barb was an avid birder, a Girl Guide leader, a member of the Getting' Higher Choir, a collector of juvenile horse fiction, a lover of cats and horses, and a dedicated dressage rider.

In 2002, Barb was named an Honourary Citizen by the City of Victoria, for her extensive volunteer work with groups including the Boys and Girls Club and the CRD Traffic Safety Commission. In 2004, the Victoria YM/YWCA named her a "Woman of Distinction".

Special thanks to Victoria Hospice staff and volunteers for their care and compassion during Barb's short time there.

Gary is lovingly remembered by his family: wife of 62 years, Jean (Goodfellow), sons Richard (Diana), Paul (Kerstin) and daughter Deidre (Kelly) Moran, his grandchildren Daryl (Cara) Keck, Nicole (Marco) Crescenzi, Sara Rutherford, Perry Rutherford and Caitlin Moran and a great granddaughter, Cameron Keck; brothers Gordon (Sandy), Douglas (Wendy) and Robert (Karen); brother-in-law James Goodfellow; and, numerous nieces, nephews and cousins. Gary was born in Swift Current, Saskatchewan to William Kenneth Rutherford and Evelyn Joan Sommerfeld who along with his stepmother Elizabeth Rutherford preceded him in death. He joined the army as a very young man and became a physical education instructor. Gary worked in the lumber industry and as a labour relations manager, a motel owner/operator, a welder and at the University of Victoria in custodial services. He and Jean were able to travel throughout Canada, UK, Mexico and parts of the USA before health concerns overtook them. Gary was caregiver to Jean for numerous years before dementia impacted him as well. Fortunately, Gary and Jean have been able to live together at Beckley Farm Lodge during the past four years where they have received excellent and loving care. Gary was a tall, slim good-looking man who liked well-made clothing; his closet was bigger than Jean's. Being colour blind meant he had an inordinate number of brown or beige articles of clothing, but they all looked great on him. He kept his shoes polished and would often wear a hat when striding down a street or hiking in nature. He enjoyed the rhythm of the natural world and was particularly fond of watching birds and taking his children out for walks to observe flora and fauna. Gary enjoyed reading, learning and mastering new things ranging from construction, home repair and chess and was excited about the power and opportunity of the internet, investing and real estate. He was generally a private and reserved man and yet he loved to laugh. He entertained his children with stories and even as his dementia overtook him by rhyming and singing. Gary was immensely proud of his immigrant family heritage who arrived in Newfoundland during the early 1800s and later included Scottish, Norwegian and Prussian immigrants arriving in Canada and the United States. Gary's approach to life was greatly impacted by being a child of the Depression and of the Prairies. Nothing was to be wasted or spent unwisely. He loved deeply, as evidenced by his enduring romance with Jean and in the pleasure he took in learning about the adventures of his family. A family event will take place at later date when we will wear brown or beige and toast Gary with a single malt, modestly priced scotch or two. We will also enjoy some food. Gary's advice about desserts will serve as a guide for us. He would say, "Divide a pie in five, eat a whole pie". Gary would most likely think cake would be appropriate for this event and as he did so often, suggest, "Any cake will do, as long as it is chocolate."

This gentle, lovely man has passed after a 3 year battle Myotonic Dystrophy. He was & is Antoinette's great love. Ted passed surrounded with love, by his wife, children, close family and dear friends.

Ted was born and raised in Duncan, a natural athlete. Ted played (pitched) little league baseball, played high school football with the Cowichan Timbermen, competed in tennis & played badminton, volleyball and basketball. Later in life Ted played flag football and old timers hockey.

Ted graduated from the University of Victoria in 1973 & started his teaching career in Kitamat, B.C. with his first wife Gill. After 2 years Ted returned to the Cowichan Valley and taught high school at Cowichan Senior Secondary until his retirement in 2009. Ted received his Masters Degree for Administrative Curriculum in 1995, at Gonzaga University in Washington State.

Throughout Ted's tenure as a teacher he spent countless hours & weekends coaching basketball (senior boys team). His passion was basketball and coaching. In 1976 Edie and Geoff began wintering in Rancho Mirage, CA. They were greatly compatible and thoroughly enjoyed their life, interests, and activities together, along with family members, in the sunshine. Now they are together again, forever.
